Itinerary:

Day 1: Arrive in Beijing (L)

Arrive into Beijing, the Imperial Capital of China for more than 800 years. You will be met by our professional guide at the airport and transfer to your hotel. Visit the Temple of Heaven, an outstanding example of Chinese religious architecture where the emperors prayed for good harvests.

Day 2: Beijing (B,L,D)

Journey to the Great Wall of China, the greatest human construction in ancient times stretching 5000 KM across the mountains like a protective dragon. Visit Chang Ling, one of the 13th Ming Tombs in which the Ming Emperors are buried. Enjoy a Peking duck dinner tonight, which is a must for all tourists to Beijing.

Day 3: Beijing (B,L)

Enter the largest imperial palace ever built in the world, the Forbidden City, where 24 emperors dwelt since Ming Dynasty to Qing Dynasty for almost 500 years as well as the site of a great number of historic events. Continue on to Summer Palace, the imperial garden, a spectacular complex of palaces and pagodas also listed as one of the World's Cultural Heritage sites.

Day 4: Beijing-Xi'an (B,L)

Fly to Xi'an, the ancient capital of China's first emperor, Qin Shi Huangdi. During the Tang Dynasty (618-907) Xi'an was the largest city in the world. Visit the ancient city wall, one of the most complete city walls in China as well as the largest ancient city military defensive systems in the world. Continue to the seven-tiered Great Wild Goose Pagoda dated back to Tang Dynasty, about 1350 years ago.

Day 5: Xi'an (B,L,D)

Excursion to the Terra-cotta Warriors Museum, site of Qin Shi Huangdi's underground army of more than 7,000 terra-cotta soldiers is the highlight of today. The Terra Cotta Warriors and Horses are the most significant archeological excavations of the 20th century. The next stop will be the Shaanxi History Museum, a first class national museum and showcase of Chinese ancient civilizations. Dumplings have a history of over 1,300 years in China, being one of the most important delicacies for special dining occasions, such as family reunion banquets at the Spring Festival, the most important festival in China. Tonight you will have a dumpling dinner and then enjoy a spectacular stage show of Tang Dynasty performance.

Day 6: Depart Xi'an (B)

Free until transfer to airport for departure homebound flight.
